HOPE FOR THE HOPELESS

It all began with a trip to a dilapidated home for girls in Santiago, Chile in 1996. As Tom Orme surveyed the crime-ridden neighborhood and the broken walls and doors of the home, his heart was broken. Thieves and sexual predators were victimizing the young girls again and again.

If ever the gospel mandate to “look after orphans in their distress” rang clear, it was here.

Tom returned to the United States and formed Vision for Chile. He began recruiting teams from churches across North America to travel to the group home in Santiago to repair, rebuild, and expand the facilities. The first team labored to restore the wall, giving immediate and necessary physical protection to the girls.

In the years since, Vision for Chile teams have built and outfitted new group homes, school facilities, a dining hall, a computer lab, vocational training spaces, walls, sidewalks, flowerbeds and more. The home has transformed into a place where young girls are blossoming in Christ’s love and finding joyful hope for their futures.

Amidst these ongoing successes though, one obvious need remains. As these precious girls turn eighteen, they are legally required to leave the home. For many of them this means a return to the streets where they first experienced abuse and neglect as children. Vision for Chile staff and volunteers long considered how best to address this recurring tragedy. In time, the idea for the House of Hope was born.



Vision for Chile mobilizes the church to care for the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of orphans and at-risk children in Santiago, Chile. We lead short-term mission trips to build homes and educational facilities and also provide long-term discipleship, mentoring, and advocacy.

THE HOUSE OF HOPE

The House of Hope is a halfway home designed to provide physical, emotional and spiritual support for the girls as they leave the orphanage. In this nurturing, sheltering environment, the young women will be able to make the transition to adulthood and independence with a loving, caring staff walking alongside them every step of the way.



Many of these precious girls are still recovering from their earlier traumatic life experiences. Ongoing support, affirmation, counsel and discipleship are vital as they move toward independence, acquire job skills, or pursue higher education. At House of Hope they will receive compassionate guidance and assistance as they work toward a personal wholeness that will allow them to build healthy marriages and families of their own some day.

Beyond these critical needs, it is our long-term vision that these girls will one day take up the torch as advocates and mentors for the next generation of Chilean children living in crippling poverty, abuse and neglect. As we invest in their lives, they learn to invest in the lives of others.
